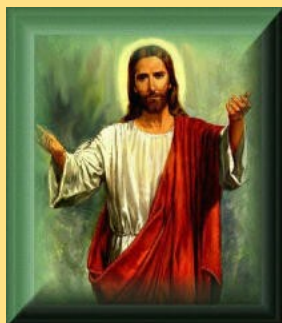

If you have any suggestions or contributions, please let the P and F know.

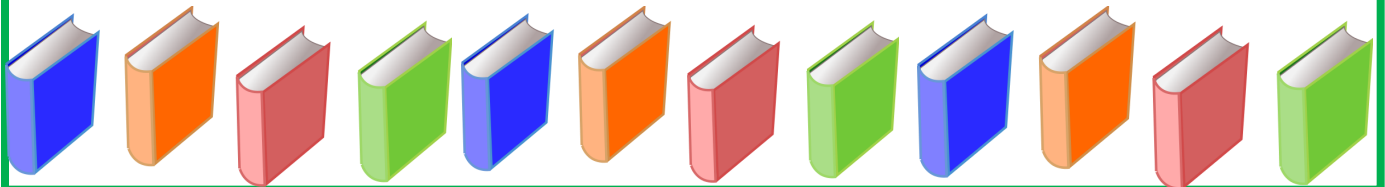
We are unfortunately postponing the Cyber Security wine and cheese night. But watch this space for a new date in term 4!

CALLING ALL VOLUNTEERS FOR THE BRUNSWICK SHOW – 23RD OCTOBER 2021

Your P&F has been given a once in a lifetime opportunity to earn \$4,000 by volunteering at the Brunswick Show on Saturday 23rd October and for 3 hours on Sunday 24th to help with some general tidy up. This money will go directly to the children to decide what it is spent on (within reason, I don't think we can afford a unicorn). We need some super people to volunteer for the following positions:

Garbologists

This will involve cruising around on a quad bike towing a trailer and emptying the rubbish bins and replacing the bin liners. It would be great to have three people at any one time doing shifts of a couple of hours at a time. Stylish high vis vests will be provided, but you'll need to bring a hat, gloves and drinking water. It might not be glamorous, but riding a quad bike is pretty cool.

Scatologist

Scatology is a bit less cool than being a garbologist on a quad bike, but if you love cattle, this is the position for you! One person is required at any one time to keep an eye on the cattle stalls and to periodically remove the poo from the pens. A top of the range, carbon fibre shovel and ergonomic wheelbarrow with dual suspension will be provided. Again, BYO hat, gloves and water. Definitely not glamorous but you'll probably get a high vis vest.

Botanists

Mrs Judy Talbot needs some helpers at 5pm to meet her at the main pavilion to empty out the bottles of water that the flowers have been displayed in. This will only take an hour and could be a good job for some of our older students perhaps? Or your kids could give you a hand? No high vis or fancy equipment needed for this job.
